Frequently Asked Questions

- 1. When will in-person worship services begin?**
 - Sunday, May 2, 2021
 - Service times: 7:15 am, 9:30 am, and 11:45 am

- 2. Will everyone be allowed to attend in-person services?**
 - No, we will initially limit capacity to 350 to 400 people to maintain 6-foot social distancing protocol for all attendees.

- 3. How will I be able to attend service with such a limited number of seats available?**
 - You will register on our web site beginning Monday, April 26 at noon and every Monday at the same time.

- 4. How long will I have to register to attend worship service(s)?**
 - You will have to register until the CDC and state increase the recommended number of attendees for indoor events to higher occupancy levels.
 - We are hopeful that this registration process will not last more than 30-45 days.

- 5. When I attend worship services will I have to comply with any special protocol such as wearing a mask and or having my temperature taken?**
 - Yes, you will have to comply with answering a Covid-19 questionnaire, wear a mask throughout the service, and submit to a temperature check before or upon entering the sanctuary.
 - Please allow ample time to complete the screening process before entering the sanctuary, which should be no longer than 5 minutes.
 - If for whatever reason, medical or otherwise, you cannot wear a mask throughout the length of service, we ask that you please attend virtual worship service. Once the current restrictions are lifted, you are welcomed to return to in-person worship.

- 6. Will I be able to sit in my favorite seat?**
 - Possibly. You will be seated by the Ushers to minimize contact with others and to help us maximize seating capacity. We will seat individuals from the front of the sanctuary to the rear. After the main floor is filled, we will seat people in the balcony until we reach capacity.

- 7. Will I be able to sit with my family?**
 - Yes, family members who register together will be seated with one another.

- 8. Will the Praise team, choir and music ministry be in attendance?**
 - Yes, we plan to have dynamic music and singing, though the choir may not be the normal size due to social distancing protocol.

- 9. If we are following strict PPE and social distancing protocol, will I have to get up to pass the offering basket to my neighbor on my row?**
 - No. We will not pass baskets anymore for offering. We will have baskets or receptacles set up at the exits so that you can drop your offering envelopes on your way out.
 - We will also encourage you to continue giving via PushPay, text (PRBC to 77977), or mail.

- 10. Will we still have baptismal service(s) on second Sunday?**
 - We will suspend baptisms until capacity restrictions are lifted and it is safe to attend worship services without mandatory mask requirements.

- 11. What should I do if I (or family members with whom I attend church) am not feeling well? Should I still attend church on Sunday?**
 - No, we invite you to please join us at one of our three virtual worship services at 7:15 am, 9:30 am, or 11:45 am.

12. What improvements has the church made to help keep everyone safe in the sanctuary?

- We have installed Aerus Air-scrubber technology to our HVAC system to purify the air in the sanctuary and other buildings on campus. Though there is nothing that can completely eliminate Covid-19 or other airborne virus from the air, the Aerus technology is one of the most effective available.

13. Will the church be cleaned and sanitized between services?

- Yes, we will use electrostatic disinfectant sprayers to sanitize doors, pews, restrooms and other contact surfaces to help slow the potential spread of Covid19 and other potential harmful viruses and bacteria.

14. Will I have to have been Covid-19 vaccinated to attend in-person worship services and show proof of vaccination?

- No, you do not have to be vaccinated to attend worship services. If you have been, you will do not have to show proof of vaccination to attend services
